### **Grants**

PI for the project "L.A. as Subject Digital Residency and Training Program," awarded \$680,395 from the Institute of Museum and Library Services as a 2014 Laura Bush 21<sup>st</sup> Century Librarian Program Grant. The grant is shared between USC, CSUN and CSUDH with co-PI managing each institution's project. The grant period is 10/1/2018-9/30/2021.
