Recommended Recordings of The Rite of Spring

It was Pierre Monteux who conducted the premiere of *The Rite of Spring*. He has commercially recorded this work twice. The first recording from 1951 is with the Boston Symphony. His second recording from 1957 is with the Paris Conservatoire Orchestra. Both recordings are still available. Either one of these recordings are essential listening. Stravinsky's own recording from 1960 with the Columbia Symphony Orchestra is also essential to hear to see how the composer later in his life interpreted his masterpiece. The Grand Depository has the LP of the 1957 Monteux recording [r782.7 S9127s:m] and the 1960 Stravinsky recording [r782.7 S9127s:st].

A more recent recording of special merit is Gergiev's 2001 recording with the Marvinsky Theater Orchestra [Music Library 9156mus]. There are also a number of very good performances that you can hear online from these online databases:





Index of nearly 900 domestic and international journals in music. Full-text for some articles available through JSTOR. 1973-present.

Rock's Backpages

Rock's Backpages is an online database of music writing, sourced from music and mainstream press. The library contains over 20,000 articles, covering the early 1960s to present. Includes album and concert reviews, feature articles, and previously unpublished interviews with major rock artists.

Interdisciplinary Databases

The following databases are a good place to begin your focused search for scholarly articles, newspaper and magazine articles, conference proceedings, and book chapters.

International Index to the Performing Arts Full Text

IPA draws its current content from more than 100 international performing arts periodicals from 9 countries, and also indexes feature performing arts articles and obituaries appearing in The New York Times and The Washington Post. IIPA covers nearly all aspects of the world of the performing arts, from the most scholarly studies to the latest crazes. Most IIPA records in the current coverage (1998 forward) contain an abstract.

JSTOR

Established in 1997, JSTOR's first collection includes core journals in economics, history, political science, and sociology, as well as in other key fields in the humanities and social sciences. This collection also contains titles in ecology, mathematics, and statistics.

Project MUSE

MUSE provides access to the complete content (including all images) of nearly 500 current scholarly journals in the humanities and social sciences.

ProQuest Research Library 👔

A multi-disciplinary index suitable for both undergraduates and graduate students. A good place to begin your research.
